Experience one of the great megalopolises of the world, Mumbai, in India this January 2018! Through fieldwork at NGOs, excursions, and classroom-based learning, students will observe and gain exposure to a range of social concerns and challenges that affect social work practice. With Mumbai as the foreground, this course brings *you* into the center of a complex urban environment—the epicenter of Bollywood and the financial capital of India—where traditions, old and new, intersect with history, culture, and innovation.

This course will be based at Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), the premier academic institution for social science education in India. During your stay in Mumbai, you will engage directly with Indian social activists, students, and faculty scholars who have dedicated themselves to addressing issues and offering culture-specific interventions in diverse settings.

Professors Hanna Kim and Subadra Panchanadeswaran look forward to sharing their background in India through this experiential learning opportunity! Dr. Kim brings her cultural anthropology background in urban western India and research interests in contemporary Indian communities, architecture, and urban spaces to the course. Dr. Panchanadeswaran, a native of Mumbai, contributes her social work background and years of research in various parts of India with NGO partners.
